

## Chairperson's Report

To the Communities of Christchurch, Nelson, Marlborough and the Chatham Islands:

The last year has been one of significant achievements by the Trust in an environment that saw considerably better investment performance than had been the case over the previous two years.

### Investment and Economic conditions

Most share markets reached their nadir in March 2009 and so using this as a starting point, paints a very rosy picture for the year. In local currency terms, global markets and Australia produced returns of over 40% for the year. New Zealand not having fallen as far as global markets previously had a lower return, but it was still one of the best years on the New Zealand stock exchange. The New Zealand dollar rebounded strongly and this penalised unhedged investors heavily.

New Zealand property produced a solid result for the year as listed vehicles rebounded. However, directly owned property had mixed results.

In the fixed interest space, New Zealand bonds performed very satisfactorily, Global bonds offered a small premium over New Zealand bonds and Cash produced a low result given the very low official cash rate.

In the USA the unemployment rate remains high at 9.7%. Despite this, US GDP rose 2.5% for the year to 31 March 2010. This was after collapsing 3.3% in the previous 12 months however inflation has not yet raised its head as a concern as the consumer price index remained suppressed, falling 0.4% over the year.

World growth has been revised upwards by the International Monetary Fund and the world economy is expected to have shrunk 0.6% in calendar year 2009 and to bounce up 4.2% in 2010. Advanced economies will continue to lag developing markets but China is expected to continue to grow at just less than 10% per annum.

In New Zealand, the economy appears to be over the worst of the recession. Unemployment which peaked at 7.1% is now down to 6.0%. In the December 2009 quarter, the annual change in GDP returned to positive territory for the first time since June 2008 and the March quarter release is expected to bring the change close to 2% for the 12 months.

Fortunately for the Reserve Bank, inflation remains benign. The annual change in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) is sitting at 2.0%, right in the middle of the Bank's target range. Nevertheless, Governor Bollard is expected to begin raising the official cash rate later in 2010.

### Investment performance

The Trust's performance was 15.5% for the year across all our managed funds compared to a benchmark return of 11.4%. This is a very good result and can be attributed to the rebound of share markets across the world as highlighted above. All managed Funds performed in excess of the benchmark apart from Australian shares, First Eagle international shares, New Zealand Assets Management international shares and the two Structured Credit Funds. However their underperformance was not of a level that has created any concerns for Trustees.

Revenue from managed Funds totaled almost \$ 59 million for the year and has allowed Trustees to begin rebuilding the Trust's Reserves, by over \$ 36 million, whilst maintaining Donation levels to the community.

Our directly owned property investments produced income of \$2.3 million during the year. The investment in these assets increased by just over \$7.3 million to \$32.5 million at year's end following the purchase of one further building. These assets provide diversification away from the managed Funds and will continue to provide the Trust with income

each year and some expected capital growth over the short to medium term.

The Trust's Investment Advisory position, was reviewed during the year and as a result, Forsyth Barr was replaced by Mercer (NZ) Limited from January 2010. Since their appointment, Mercer has worked closely with Trustees to ensure best practice investment processes are used by the Trust. There were no other significant investment changes during the year with Mercer continuing to recommend a conservative approach to investing.

### Donations

For the year ended 31 March 2010 donations totaling \$19.58 million were made to our communities.

In addition, it is pleasing to report that over \$2.6 million was expended on our 20th Anniversary Community Housing Project bringing total donations for this Project to over \$13.05 million. The process of identifying and approving projects that meet the Trust's policy will continue this year.

Since our inception 22 years ago, the Trust has donated more than \$273 million to the community.

A full list of this years donations is set out later in this publication.

Trustees resolved earlier this year that the policy of committing four per cent of the Trust's capital for donations to the community in the coming year is to be continued. This will ensure that donations for the year to 31 March 2010 will increase slightly to \$ 20 million.

### Community loans

Our Community loans continue to be popular with those organisations which have the ability to repay a loan to the Trust.

The amount out on loan at 31 March 2010 was \$4.318 million. All repayments were up to date at 31 March 2010.

### Our communities

Trustees are mindful of the effort a large number of volunteers give to their communities through the organisations we fund. We are pleased to be able to assist your organisations in an effort to help others to make a difference to the social, economic, cultural, recreational and environmental wellbeing of our communities.

I offer my and the Trustees thanks for all you do to make our communities a better place to live, work and relax.

### Trustees

In October 2009 Fran Jessep, Mary-Ellen O'Connor, Richard Tankersley and Bob Todd retired from the Trust. I wish to record the thanks of the Trust for their untiring efforts in the Board decision making process and serving their communities. Thank you to all of you for all you did during your time as a Trustee.

It was a pleasure to welcome Bill Dahlberg, Alec Neill, Dorothy Oakley and Joseph Thomas as Trustees from October 2009. Already these new Trustees have shown their willingness to learn about the operation of the Trust and to apply the considerable skills they bring to the Board table.

Trustees are appointed by the Minister of Finance and are required to have a knowledge of, or experience in banking, business, law, accountancy or an interest or involvement in the community. The role of a Trustee is one of governance which includes the overseeing of the investment of a considerable amount of funds, the distribution of the proceeds of these investments to our communities and the overall strategic direction of the Trust both now, and into the future, by attending regular Board and Donation Allocation meetings.

A hugely rewarding role that Trustees also have is going

into their communities to meet and mix with some of the most wonderful and incredibly supportive people and groups you would ever wish to meet as they go about assisting their communities.

I wish to provide an assurance that although your Trustees have strong links with the community in a number of ways, any Conflict of Interest – perceived or otherwise – is advised at the time in accordance with the Trust's policy and where necessary, the Trustee takes no part in the discussion related to the matter. All Conflicts of Interest are clearly recorded in the Minutes of the meeting concerned.

### Our staff

During the year the Trust undertook an Organisational Review of our staff levels. As a result of that Review a Donations Manager was appointed to lead the Donations Team and the Donations team was increased in size by one full time staff member. One of the key objectives of the Review is to ensure sufficient staff to carry out their role and to have greater contact with groups in the community. As a consequence of increasing the size of our team our offices at Oxford Terrace were no longer large enough, so we have recently shifted to 12 Hazledean Road, Addington.

To Wayne – the Trust Manager – and his team of Catherine, Dianna, Eamonn, Emma, Eve, Jana, Louise, Michael, and Wendy I wish to thank you for all that you do to serve the Trust and for the effort you make to support the Trustees in carrying out their governance role. Thank you also for reaching out to our communities as the first point of contact with the Trust. First impressions last a lifetime. Your efforts are much appreciated by all of us.

### Our Advisers

To our Advisers, Martin Hadlee – Financial Adviser, Wendy Skinner – Accountancy Support Adviser, Russell Garrett and

Martin Lewington – Mercer, Peter Cook – Direct Property Adviser, and all those who provided advice and guidance during the year I thank you all on behalf of the Trustees. Your counsel has been much appreciated.


### Looking forward

## A Year of Change and Achievement

The year under review can be summarised as "one of significant change and achievement". A year in which investment returns exceeded budget expectation, donation levels maintained at 4% of core capital, the long awaited donation management system progressed through to user acceptance testing, an external organisational review was completed, new staff appointed and a move to new premises completed in April. Throughout the year we were again humbled and overwhelmed by the opportunities to interact with the community and to share first-hand the challenges faced each day.

The annual report can only highlight a few of these opportunities, and the groups mentioned below are a sample of the work undertaken in our thriving communities.

### Rescue & Technical Support Trust

Trustees provided assistance to this specialist civil defence rescue team to replace and provide suitable clothing and boots to existing and new members.

### Age Concern Oral Health Service

Funding was provided towards enhancing domiciliary dental services, enabling older people in Canterbury to have real choices.

### Whaka Raupo Carving Centre Trust

Trustees continued support towards the operations of the carving school, which provides people of all cultures the opportunity to learn the traditional art of Maori carving.

### Spinyback Tuatara Education & Conservation Charitable Trust

Trustees assisted to promote the conservation of endangered tuatara through educational roadshow presentations to schools throughout Nelson and Marlborough.

### Kaikoura Education Trust

Trustees provided support for the young people of Kaikoura to develop artistic skills in music, dance, film, animation and photography.

### Centre for Fine Woodworking Trust

Funding was provided towards renovations of the main workshop area and purchase/construction of a new storage facility at this centre, which was established to facilitate high quality educational opportunities for woodworkers from New Zealand.

### Tasman Broadcasting Trust

Trustees continued support in completion of the infrastructure redevelopment and upgrading of the programme delivery network, for this community access radio that services the people of the Tasman District.

### NZ Foundation for Conductive Education

Trustees provided administration support for the ongoing work in assisting those with a disability increase their self confidence and gain more independence.

### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### Significant accounting policies

#### 1 Reporting entity

The Canterbury Community Trust (the "Parent") is a charitable trust, domiciled in New Zealand, incorporated in accordance with the provisions of The Community Trust Act 1999.

Consolidated financial statements are presented for The Canterbury Community Trust. The consolidated financial statements of the Group as at and for the year ended 31 March 2010 comprise the Parent and its subsidiaries (together referred to as the "Group") and the Group's interest in associates and jointly controlled entities.

The Group is a charitable trust which distributes income from its investment activities to the communities of Canterbury, Nelson, Marlborough and the Chatham Islands.

#### 2 Basis of preparation

##### (a) Statement of compliance

The summary financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Practice in New Zealand (NZ GAAP) as it relates to summary financial statements.

The accounting policies set out in the full audited financial report.

The financial statements have been approved by the Board of Trustees on 5 July 2010.

The information included in this report has been prepared in accordance with FRS 43: Summary Financial Statements. The specific disclosures included in the summary financial report have been extracted from the full audited financial report dated 5 July 2010. Users of the summary financial statements should note that the information contained therein cannot be expected to provide a complete understanding as provided in the full financial report of the Group. The full audited financial statements

comply with New Zealand equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards, and its interpretations (NZ IFRS) and other applicable Financial Reporting Standards, as appropriate for public benefit entities.

statements of the Trust and are consistent in all material respects with the full financial statements, upon which we expressed an unqualified audit opinion in our report to the members dated 8 July 2010; and

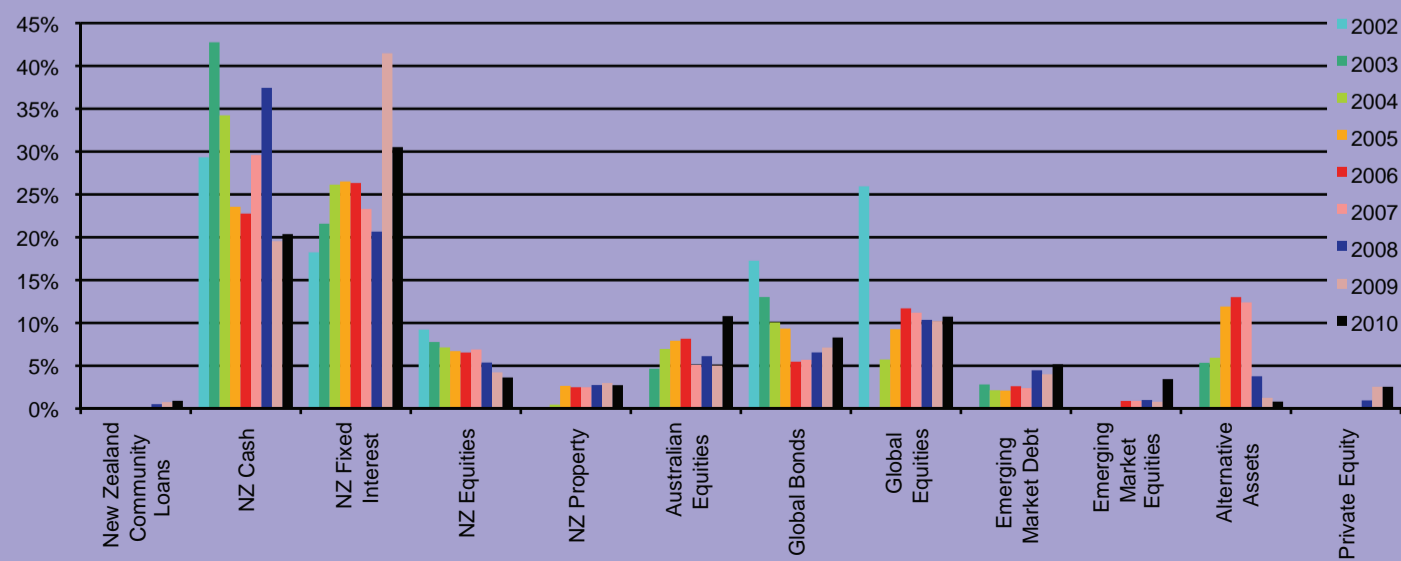
(b) the information reported in the summary financial statements complies with Financial Reporting Standard No.43 - Summary Financial Statements.

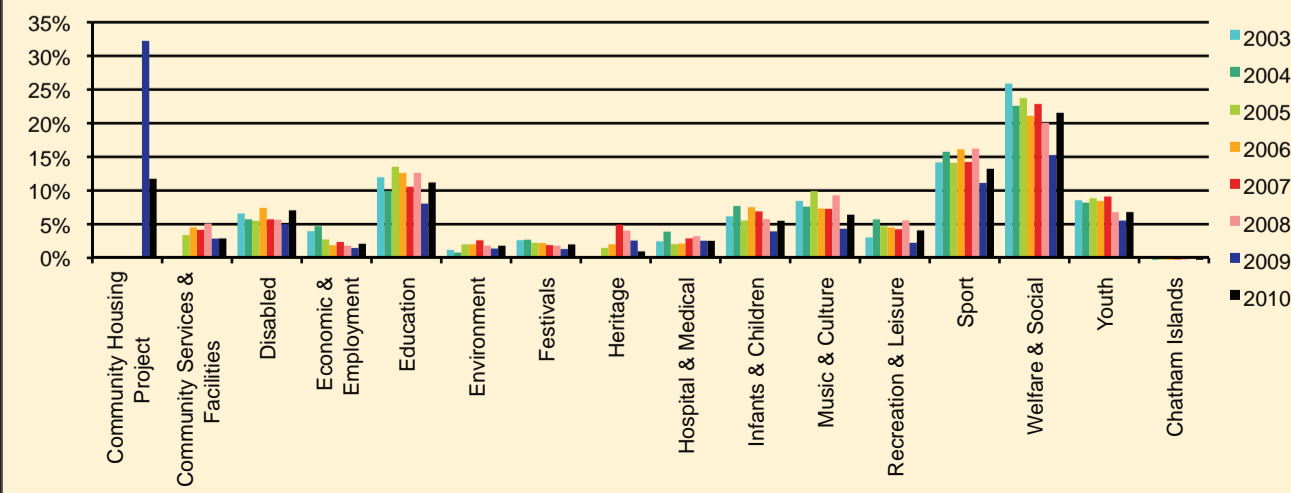


### Trustees' Remuneration

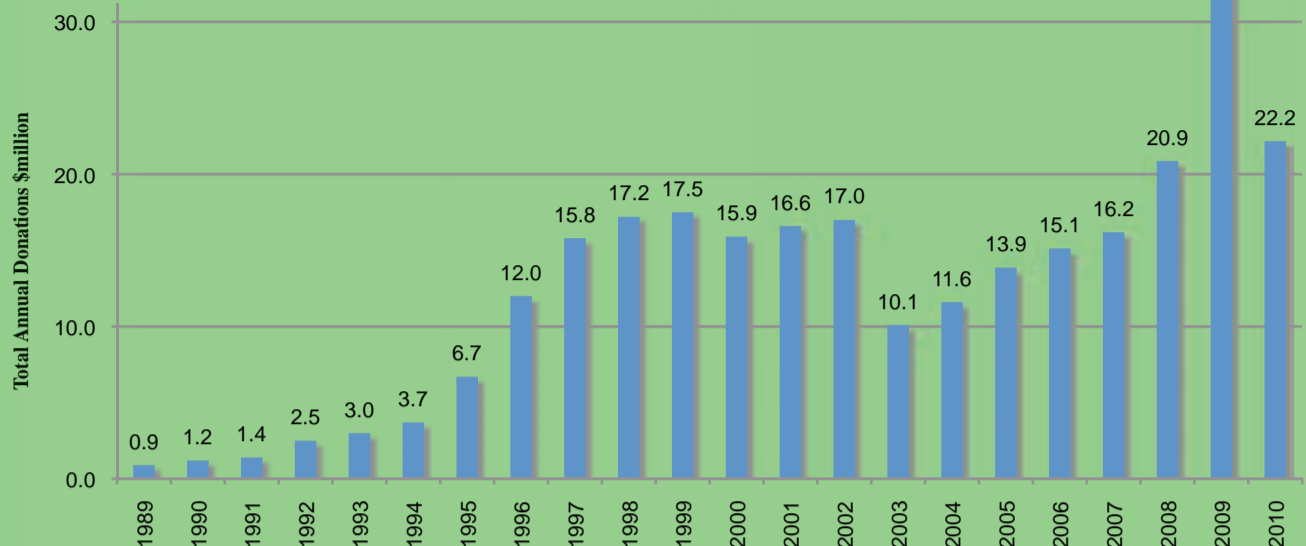

### TRUST GOVERNANCE

Trustees acting as a board are collectively responsible for the proper direction and control of the Trust's activities. The Trustees monitor and guide the affairs of the Trust, in particular, its investment strategy and donations to approved organisations.

The Trust Manager has delegated authority within approved guidelines for the day to day management of the Trust.

Trustees generally meet monthly for Board and donation meetings and additionally as required. Trustees are active in visiting applicant groups and are involved in donation events.

It is recognised that Trustees may have a wide range of involvement with the community and therefore the potential for a conflict of interest will arise from time to time. To cover this issue, a Trustee who has any direct or indirect association, as a member or officer, or otherwise, with any organisation from which the Trustees are considering a current application, is required to disclose the nature of that interest at a meeting of the Trustees. Such disclosures are recorded in the minutes of the meeting.

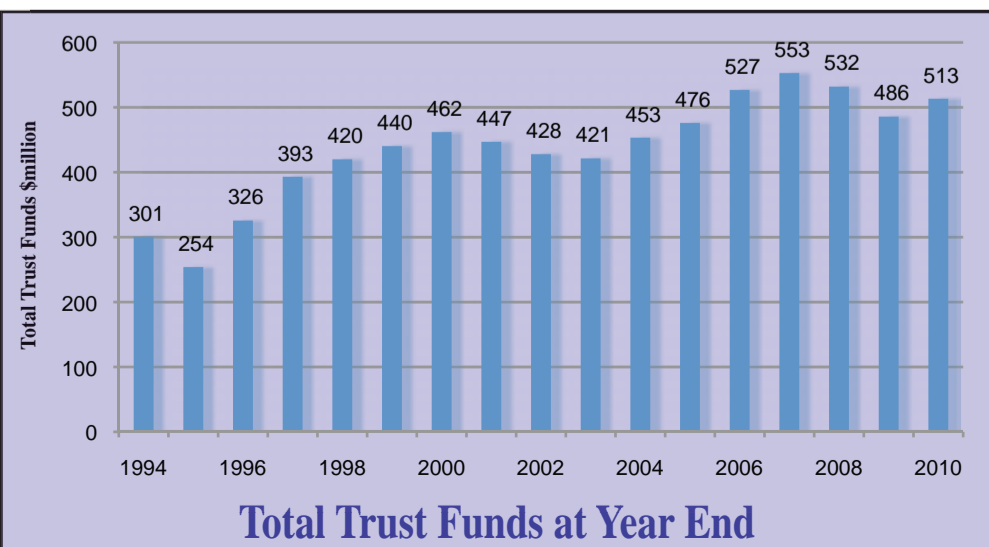
