

Chairperson's Report

It is again with pleasure that I present my annual report for the 2007 / 2008 financial year. The year was again a most interesting and busy one for the Trust, with donations of \$21m made to 1,148 community projects in Canterbury, Nelson and Marlborough and the Chatham Islands. It is gratifying to see how not-for-profit groups can create wonderful benefits for their communities from our donations.

However, the returns on our investments for the past year have been disappointing as a result of very difficult economic and investment conditions. It was demonstrated that the Trust's financial assets and returns were not immune to the vagaries of global events and unforeseen risks.

It has been a tumultuous and volatile period as the global credit crisis deepened in the United States and spread around the world. Complicated derivative-based structures (in which the identity of the underlying assets and of the ultimate owners was not clear) have led to massive financial losses, losses in confidence and liquidity issues on a world-wide basis. Layers of credit risk were not clearly understood. Bailouts of overseas financial institutions by central banks, the failure of a large number of finance companies in New Zealand, and volatile commodity, bond and currency prices have contributed to reduced confidence levels.

With over half a billion dollars of funds invested in a range of diversified asset classes, it was not unreasonable to expect that our portfolio would have been better insulated and protected from losses, but the impact of the financial turmoil has been so widespread during the last twelve months that the majority of asset classes turned in unsatisfactory results. Nevertheless, the diversified and generally conservative investment strategy adopted by the Trust limited our investment losses to \$5m for the year, a little less than 1% of the value of our assets.

Recognising that bust would surely follow boom in the international business cycle, the Trust had built up reserves of over \$70m during the boom years. As a result of this prudent policy, the Trust will be able to honour its commitment to make donations each year of 4% of its capital, approximately \$21m.

The Trust's advisers have continued to recommend a conservative and prudent approach to the portfolio weightings to emphasize cash returns to meet donation commitments, especially until a more healthy credit environment returns. As the global credit crunch is predicted to be long-lasting, a cautious approach will need to be taken to manage costs and to preserve reserves as far as possible.

In order to achieve further diversification and improve long-term returns, there has been a drawdown of funds from other investments to continue the development of a property portfolio of directly owned and jointly owned commercial properties, now valued at over \$26m. Rents from these properties are budgeted at \$1.8m in the coming year.

This year marks the 20th anniversary of the establishment of Community Trusts, which, as a result of the government's decision to introduce the Trustee Banks Restructuring Act in May 1988, were formed to become shareholders of the various Trust Banks. Since its inception 20 years ago, our Trust has distributed some \$220m to the Nelson, Marlborough, Canterbury and Chatham Island communities.

Reflecting on the many social challenges that we still face, and the well documented connections between housing and poverty, the Trustees of The Canterbury Community Trust resolved to celebrate the 20th anniversary by allocating \$20m to a project to construct social/affordable housing. Discussions are presently being conducted with likely partners so that we get the best value for our contribution.

A significant decision made during the year was to allocate \$1.2m, spread over three years, to the Christchurch Cathedral Restoration Project. This donation, the second highest since the Trust's inception, was specifically for re-slating the roof of the Cathedral, which is not only an iconic building and the heart and soul of Christchurch, but also attracts 700,000 visitors a year.

Trustees

After having served eight years as a Trustee Pam Richardson did not seek reappointment on expiry of her second term. Pam proved to be a most valuable Trustee who made a significant contribution to the Trust and in particular in the rural communities with her profound knowledge of those areas. It was a pleasure to welcome Sally Thompson as a newly appointed Trustee.

Trustees are appointed by the Minister of Finance for a term of 4 years, but may be reappointed. They are required to have a knowledge of, or experience in, banking, business, law, accountancy, or an interest or involvement in the community. They are also bound by the legal requirements of several statutes and common law. The role of Trustees is one of governance, which includes the management of significant wealth generated by investments, which is then distributed to non-profit organisations for community initiatives. Trustees attend regular Board and donation allocation meetings and consult with groups and organisations so that we all have a better understanding of our respective operations and as a consequence there is quite a time commitment involved. One of the most rewarding aspects of the role is the opportunity given to Trustees to meet and associate with some of the most caring, compassionate and committed organisations and individuals in our community, who are devoted to providing a wide range of services to those amongst us who for a number of reasons have become marginalised.

I can assure you that although our Trustees have strong links with the community in other capacities any bias through that connection is put aside when considering applications and our system is totally transparent, with the normal conflict of interest conventions applying and specific conflicts being noted as a matter of public record.

Staff and Advisers

To Wayne Ward, Trust Manager and his most capable staff of Trisha Waters, Eve Nissen, Louise McLean, Jana Laing, Emma Hogwood and Wendy Courtois, I offer my sincere thanks for their commitment, dedication and impartiality in their respective roles. Being the first point of contact most applicants have with the Trust, staff play an important role in the success of the Trust, and we are particularly fortunate to have such a competent team.

The support they provide Trustees with their assessment of donation applications and accompanying reports is invaluable to Trustees when determining levels of donations to organisations. This is a task they perform with a high degree of professionalism.

Also of importance is the excellent relationship that exists between staff and Trustees, which adds to the high standard of delivery that the Trust provides.

Martin Hadlee and Wendy Skinner, from Hadlee Kippenberger and partners, have again provided Trustees with quality guidance and support, which was appreciated and for which we thank them.

We also thank Forsyth Barr, our Investment Advisors, for their professional advice through what has been a difficult period. I thank all the other professional advisors who have assisted the Trust; we value the service they provide.

Community

Again, we are indebted to the many organisations that we fund and the large number of associated volunteers who untiringly give their time and energy. This makes a huge impact on the social, economic, cultural, environmental and recreational wellbeing of our respective communities; without their efforts we would be much the poorer.

The contribution made by volunteers should not be undervalued. In fact, it cannot be overstated as they give their time free at the expense of their own free time.

The Trust's primary goal is to help people first and this is reflected in the way donations are allocated. The Trust's priority is to channel its funds as effectively as it can for the greatest possible benefit of the community and its people, and to make our communities better places for everyone to live.

I believe our present donation model and policy goes some way to achieving this purpose, as we are helping today for a better tomorrow.

Conclusion

This will be the last Chairperson's Annual Report that I will have the privilege of presenting, as after six years in the role I will not be seeking re-election. It is a role I have enjoyed immensely and I sincerely thank past and present Trustees for their support and the professional manner in which they have conducted the business of the Trust. May I also thank the staff for the courteous and friendly manner in which I have always been received and their assistance during my term as Chairperson.

Donation Budgets Increased

The 2007 / 2008 financial year was yet another exciting and challenging period for the Trust. Donation budgets were again increased. Applications received were an increase on prior years. More applicant groups were visited by Trustees and staff however, the volatility of investment markets contributed to a disappointing financial result.

Donation approvals for the year totalled \$20,868,000, an increase of 28% compared to the previous year. A further three Community Loans were approved bring the total to 16.

Trust assets exceeded \$525 million at balance date with revenue reserves of \$51.0 million. The Trust is well positioned to maintain its donation distribution policy.

The photographs included in the report together with the brief snap shot below highlight but a few of the community activities supported by Trustees during the year. These could be repeated over a 1000 times and all would be different.

Sumner Community Centre

The Centre in Sumner is host to many Community activities. The Trust has provided a regular contribution to the Centre's running costs.

Burwood Academy Trust

The Academy has established a centre for research and learning in Rehabilitation at the Burwood Spinal Unit. Trustees have agreed to support the establishment phase.

Asia New Zealand Foundation

Trustees have again supported the popular lantern festival in Victoria Square.

Antarctic Heritage Trust

The Heritage Trust is undertaking a major relocation and conservation project of iconic Antarctic exhibits. Trustees have agreed to support this significant project for two years.

Kaiapoihia Pa

A donation was approved to assist with the redevelopment of the Pa and the surrounding land at this historic site.

Peninsular Plains Orienteer's Inc

Trustees have provided support towards the research, planning and production of new course maps for the Canterbury region.

Club 24

Nelson Trustees approved a donation to assist members of the Club enjoy a real outdoor adventure. The Club works with those in the community with a mental incapacity.

Parklands School

The Motueka Community will benefit from the contribution of the new school and community swimming pool.

Waimea Tramping Club

Club members will enjoy the benefit of additional personal locator beacons, purchased with the assistance of donation funding.

Picton Emergency Operations Centre Trust - Marlborough

Trustees have agreed to support the construction of a multi-purpose emergency Centre in Picton.

Awatere Community Activities

This Seddon based community group is the information hub for community activities. Trustees continue to assist with meeting overhead costs.

Takahanga Marae Charitable Trust - Kaikoura

Trustees approved a donation to assist with refurbishment of marae facilities.

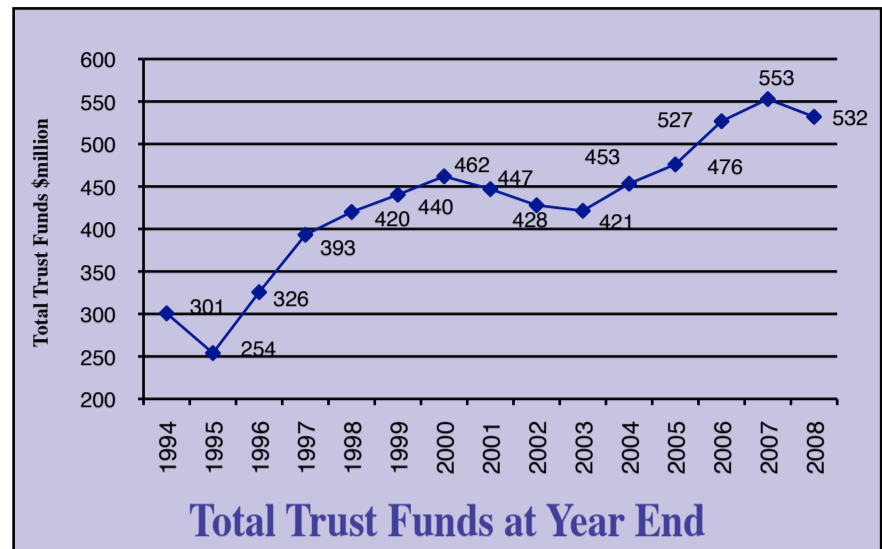

Unqualified opinion

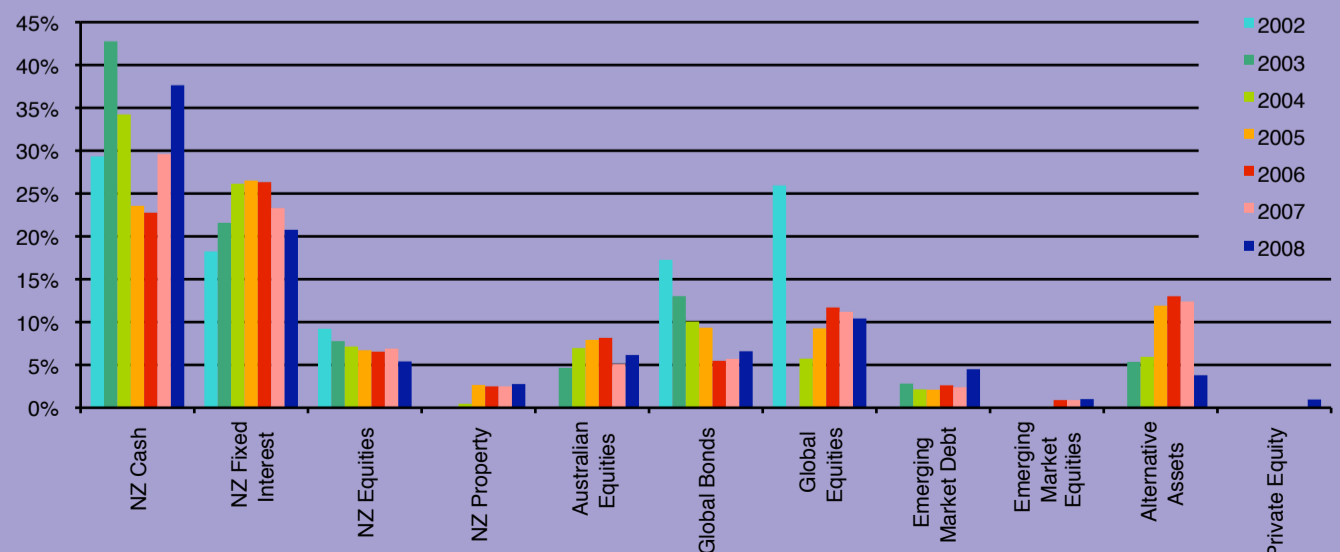

The Canterbury Community Trust Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31st March 2008

Significant accounting policies

1 Reporting entity

The Canterbury Community Trust (the "Parent") is a charitable trust, domiciled in New Zealand, incorporated in accordance with the provisions of The Community Trust Act 1999.

Consolidated summary financial statements are presented for The Canterbury Community Trust. The consolidated summary financial statements of the Group as at and for the year ended 31 March 2008 comprise the Parent and its subsidiaries (together referred to as the "Group") and the Group's interest in associates and jointly controlled entities.

The Group is a charitable trust which distributes income from its investment activities to the communities of Canterbury, Nelson, Marlborough and the Chatham Islands.

2 Basis of preparation

(a) Statement of compliance

The summary financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Practice in New Zealand (NZ GAAP) for public benefit entities. These are the Group's first financial statements and NZ IFRS 1 has been applied.

The information included in this report has been prepared in accordance with FRS 43: Summary Financial Statements. The specific disclosures included in the summary financial report have been extracted from the full audited financial report dated 28 July 2008. Users of the summary financial statements should note that the information contained therein cannot be expected to provide a complete understanding as provided in the full financial report of the group.

Users who require additional information are encouraged to access the full financial statements in the Group's website at www.comtrust.org.nz. Users who do not have access to the website can request a printed version from the following address; PO Box 1440, Christchurch.

The full financial report and this summary have received an unqualified audit opinion. The summary financial statements were authorised for issue by the Board of Trustees on 28 July 2008.

The impact of adopting NZ IFRS has had no effect on the Income Statement or Statement of Cash flows compared to those previously reported under NZ GAAP.

On adoption of NZ IFRS derivatives have been separated from investments on the Balance Sheet. As at 31 March 2007 this had the impact of increasing current liabilities and current assets by \$603,000.

The accounting policies set out below have been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements and in preparing an opening NZ IFRS balance sheet at 1 April 2006 for the purposes of the transition to NZ IFRS.

(b) Functional and presentation currency

These financial statements are presented in thousands of New Zealand dollars (\$000's), which is the Parent and Group's functional currency. All financial information presented in New Zealand dollars has been rounded to the nearest thousand.

3 Subsequent event

There were no subsequent events after the year end of 31 March 2008 (2007 none).

4 Explanation of change in accounting policies

The group has changed several accounting policies. In accordance with NZ IFRS, the accounting policies have been changed retrospectively from 1 April 2006. The impact and description of the changes are set out in the following tables:

4 Explanation of change in accounting policies (continued)

Changes in accounting policies

(a) In prior years costs of disposing investment property have not been deducted from the carrying value of the investment property.

This has resulted in an increase in the carrying value of investment property at 1 April 2006 of \$220,000 and decreased reported profit for the year ended 31 March 2007 by the same amount.

(b) The Group has changed its accounting policy to recognise all donations as distributions from equity. In the previous years financial statements certain distributions had been accounted for as an expense. The impact of the change in accounting policy has been to increase profit in the year ended 31 March 2007 by \$12,170,000.

(c) The Group has changed its accounting policy in respect of capital base transfers. Transfers are now recognised as movements in equity rather than as an expense in the Income Statement. The impact of the change in accounting policy is to increase profits for the year by \$13,399,000.

(d) For the year ending 31 March 2008, the Group changed their accounting policy to recognise donations paid at the point when they have been approved by the Trustees and there are no further obligations that the donation recipient has to fulfil to receive the donation. This had the impact of increasing donations payable at 1 April 2006 by \$946,000 and by \$2,041,000 at 31 March 2007. There is no impact on the Income Statement as donations are recognised as distributions from equity as noted in point (b) above.

TRUST GOVERNANCE

The Board of the Trust comprises twelve Trustees appointed by the Minister of Finance for terms of four years.

Trustees acting as a board are collectively responsible for the proper direction and control of the Trust's activities. The Trustees monitor and guide the affairs of the Trust, in particular, its investment strategy and donations to approved organisations.

The Trust Manager has delegated authority within approved guidelines for the day to day management of the Trust.

Trustees generally meet monthly for Board and donation meetings and additionally as required. Trustees are active in visiting applicant groups and are involved in donation events.

It is recognised that Trustees may have a wide range of involvement with the community and therefore the potential for a conflict of interest will arise from time to time. To cover this issue, a Trustee who has any direct or indirect association, as a member or officer, or otherwise, with any organisation from which the Trustees are considering a current application, is required to disclose the nature of that interest at a meeting of the Trustees. Such disclosures are recorded in the minutes of the meeting.



The Trust has provided regular support to the Festival and Events Trust, Marlborough who organise many community events throughout the year including those at the Great Marlborough Treasure Hunt.



The Trust each year has provided a donation to the Christchurch Children's Christmas Parade Trust to build new floats or bring favourite friends to the parade. Scooby and friends joined the parade this year.

Richard Tankersley, BA, Cert Comm Psyc Care

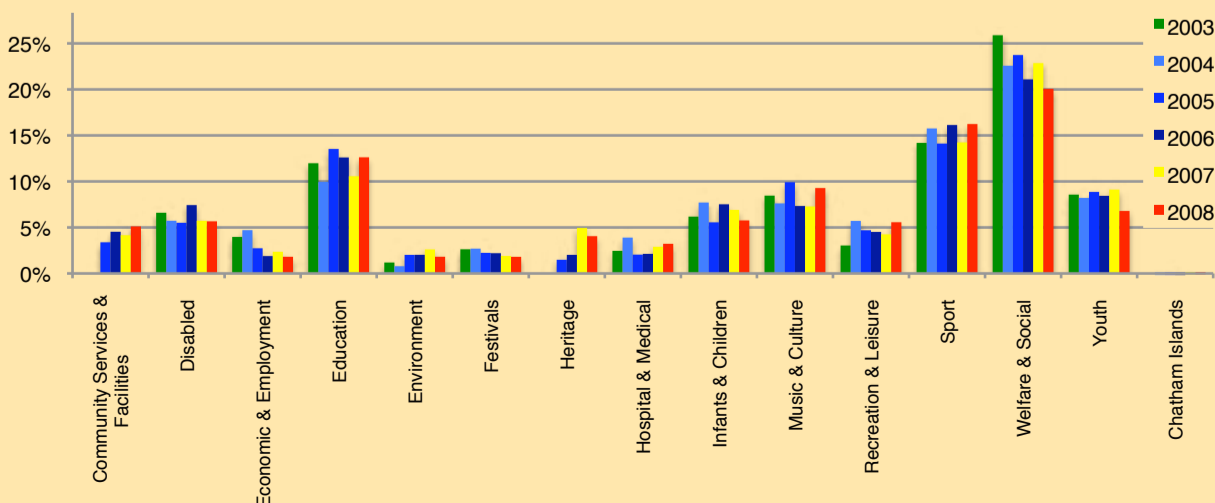

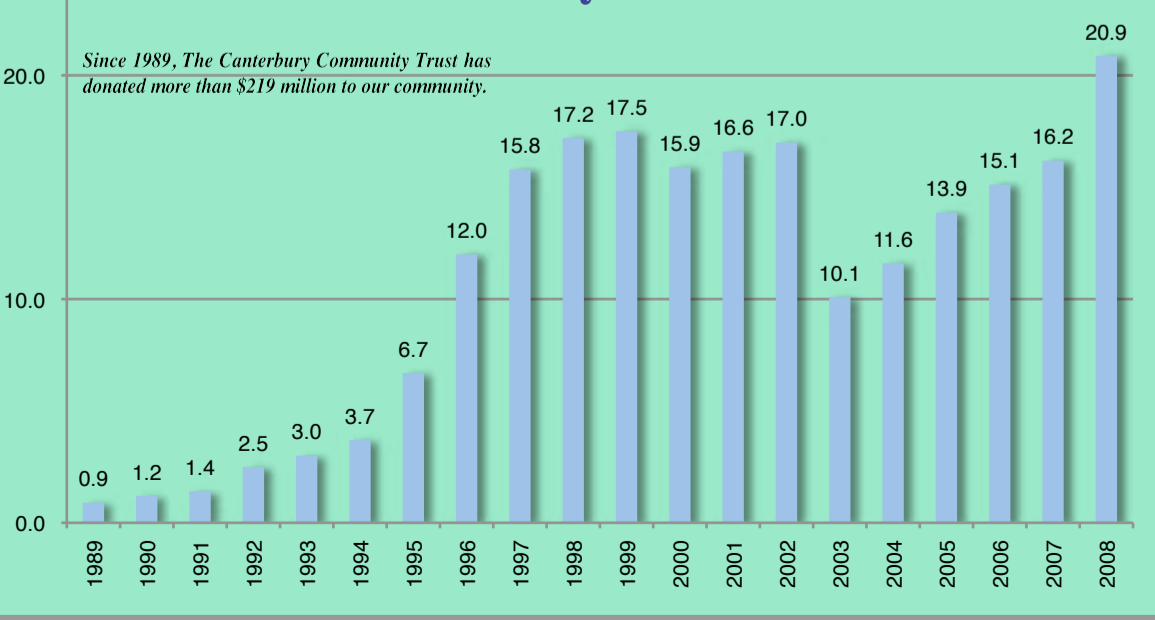
